How to Have a Quiet Time

- **1**. Each day, you should find a time that is right for you to spend with God.
- 2. Find a quiet place. Turn the radio and TV off.
- 3. Approach God with the highest respect.
- 4. Remember, God loves you and cares about your every need.
- 5. Do not do all the talking. Let God speak to your heart.
- 6. If God shows you something in His Word (the Bible), "Do it."
- 7. Write down your prayer requests and the date of your requests so that you can see how God answers your prayers. You will learn how to do this later in your studies.
- 8. Journal: It is hard to remember all the things that God will do in your life. Write down specific things that He does so that you can look back during hard times and be encouraged. You can write out your prayers if you like and be able to voice your desires and burdens in written form. As you study, write down what you have learned in your journal. You can find journal pages in the back of this book.
- 9. Spend time daily memorizing and meditating on your memory verses.
- 10. Put on the whole armor of God daily. (See page 30 to learn how to do this.)



How Do I Find Things in the Bible?

The Bible appears to be a big book, and it is. Do not let that scare you away from finding out who God really is and more about His wonderful plan for your life. 2 Timothy 2:15 says, "Be diligent to present yourself approved to God, a worker who does not need to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth." The Bible is God's Word. God inspired men years ago to write the words of the Bible for us so that we can know how to live our lives.


How can I find things in the Bible?

Turn to the front pages of your Bible to the Table of Contents. Find the book of the Bible you are looking for (Matthew, Mark, Luke, etc.). The Bible is a large book that has many smaller books in it. Next, find the page number of that book. Table of Contents

Once you find the page number for the book you are looking for, turn to that page. You will be on the page of the first chapter of that book. The Bible is divided up into books, chapters, and verses. If someone says, "Turn to John 1:2," they are saying to turn to the book of John, Chapter 1, verse 2. See example below:




LESSON ONE: Why Is the Bible Important?

The Bible is a special book because it was written by men who were inspired by God—He told them what to write. It is called the "Word of God" because God speaks through it. The Bible is divided into books, almost like a library. Christians, those who believe in Jesus Christ, read it at home, at church, or anywhere to see what God is saying to them. The Bible is still just as important today as when it was written many years ago. With it, you can find answers and direction for your life. The Bible has been read by more people than any other book in history. The Bible is divided into two parts: the Old Testament and the New Testament. The Old Testament tells the story of the Jewish people and their relationship with God. The New Testament tells us about the life of Jesus and the first people-Christians-who believed in Him as the Son of God.

The Bible is inspired by God and can be trusted for direction.

2 Timothy 3:16-17 says, "All Scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness, that the man of God may be complete, thoroughly equipped for every good work."

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LESSON TWO: How Do I Study the Bible?

The Bible has so many wonderful stories of lives that have been touched and changed by God. Men and women, boys and girls alike throughout the ages have discovered God's wonderful love and purpose for their lives. There is a simple way to be blessed by what you read in the Bible. Use the S.P.A.C.E. acrostic to learn how to apply what God is saying to you from His Word as you read each day. Remember, if God says it, you should do it!

Sin to confess

Sin is anything you think, say, do, or don't do that displeases God. Some verses you read will reveal sin in your life. Confess it to God, and then ask Him to forgive you of your sins (1 John 1:9).

Promise to claim

When God makes a promise in His Word, you know that you can count on Him to always keep His promises to you.

Attitude to change


This is a time to have an attitude check to make sure your life aligns with the will of God.

Command to obey

When God's Word tells you to do something, it should be taken as a command to obey (James 1:22-25).

LESSON THREE: What Does it Mean to Be Saved?



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

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LESSON FIVE: How Do I Talk With God?

Jeremiah 33:3 says, "Call to Me, and I will answer you, and show you great and mighty things, which you do not know." God says for us to call on Him and He will answer our call—He is talking about prayer. There is a simple way to start your prayer life called P.R.A.Y. Each day, you should pray and spend time alone with God. He is there for you 24/7, and He will be your best friend.

Praise & thanksgiving

Take a moment each day to worship God and praise His name for what He has done for you. After your time of praise, offer up to God prayers of thanksgiving. There is a lot to be thankful for, so do not forget to tell God thank You. Hebrews 13:15a says, "Therefore by Him let us continually offer the sacrifice of praise to God."

Repent

Repent and confess your sins to God. *Repent* means to stop sinning and turn to God. First John 1:9 says, "If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us *our* sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness."





God answers prayers in three different ways:

- Yes—God chooses to give you what you ask.
- Wait—God sometimes wants you to wait on Him.
- No-It is not His will to give you what you ask.

"Ask, and it will be given to you; seek, and you will find; knock, and it will be opened to you. For everyone who asks receives, and he who seeks finds, and to him who knocks it will be opened." (Matthew 7:7-8)

Yield & Surrender

Romans 12:1 says, "I beseech you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that you present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable to God, *which is* your reasonable service." Surrendering your life to God for His service is a holy and pleasing sacrifice to Him.



Jesus said in John 15:5, "I am the vine, you are the branches. He who abides in Me, and I in him, bears much fruit; for without Me you can do nothing." Abiding in Christ means to be totally dependent on Him every day. You must surrender your life to Jesus, giving Him your all. By abiding in Christ, you will become a new person, and you will bear spiritual fruit. To *abide* means to "remain" or stay with Jesus all the time.

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Abiding in the Vine

The day you accepted Jesus as your Savior and invited Him to come into your heart, He made His dwelling in you and has been there ever since. Jesus promised that He would never leave you, so He sent the Holy Spirit to live in your heart to help you and be your guide. In order for you to have and experience everything God has planned for you, you will need to learn to allow Him to have control.

Jesus wants all of you. When you allow Jesus to have His way in your life, you will begin to see change. He will help you each day to make the right choices when you fully rely on Him. Remember, wherever you go, He goes with you because He lives in you.

LESSON SEVEN: Telling Others About Jesus

Go and tell others about Him. 3. Jesus died and rose again to pay for your sins.

"For I delivered to you first of all that which I also received: that Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, and that He was buried, and that He rose again the third day according to the Scriptures." (1 Corinthians 15:3-4)



- 4. You must choose to receive Jesus as your Savior and Lord. You must A, B, C:
 - Admit that you are a sinner.

 - Choose to receive Him as your Savior and Lord.

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

1. Organization / Administration: Titus was to organize the ministry in Crete. In 1 Corinthians 12:28, there is a list of spiritual gifts. One is administration. The person with this gift helps the church organize itself and be effective in ministering to each other and in reaching out to the world.

2. Giving: The gift of giving expresses itself in a desire to give above and beyond our ten percent tithe. The person with this gift finds it easy to give freely and is very cheerful in doing so.

3. Service: The gift of service expresses itself in a desire to serve others. The person with this gift finds it easy to be a servant in the church and finds great joy and fulfillment in doing so.

DEFINITIONS OF SPIRITUAL GIFTS

4. Evangelism: The gift of evangelism is the ability to explain clearly to lost people how to become Christians and to persuade them to desire to be saved.

5. Prophecy: The gift of prophecy enables a person to speak God's Word boldly so that it brings conviction of sin. Prophets will speak to people and confront them concerning sin.

6. Teaching: The gift of teaching is the ability to teach Bible truths in a way that others can understand and be built up in their faith.

7. Encouragement / Exhortation: Romans 12:6-8, lists several gifts of the Spirit. The gift of encouragement, or exhortation, is one of those gifts. It is given to build up the body of Christ. The person with the gift of encouragement is able to build up individual people as well as the body of Christ.

8. Shepherd / Leadership: The gift of a shepherd is to lead, guide, and feed the flock of God—the church. The shepherd, or pastor, is gifted by the Holy Spirit to be a leader. He has the ability and desire to teach, protect, and build up the church.

9. Mercy: Those who have the gift of mercy see the needs of others and find it easy to help them. They are aware of people's needs around them.

10. Faith: The gift of faith is an unwavering trust in what God promises. The person with the gift of faith believes that God will be faithful to His Word.

11. Helps: Christians with the gift of helps are those who like to work to assist or help another person's ministry. They usually work behind the scenes.

LESSON TEN: Why Do I Need to Be Baptized?

Jesus commands all of His followers to be baptized. Baptism is an act of obedience to God. Jesus was baptized and says you need to be baptized, too. Baptism does not save you. Baptism is a command from God. Baptism is like a picture of two things. When a believer goes under the water, it is a picture of Christ's death; when the believer comes out of the water, it is a picture of Christ's resurrection—Jesus coming back to life. For you it is also a picture of what happened inside you. The Bible says that old things have passed away (your old self is gone), and you are brand new. Find the answers to the secret codes below.

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LESSON ELEVEN: Communion

Communion, or the Lord's Supper, is a special time to remember what Jesus did for you. Each part of the service is an important reminder of Jesus' death and the price He paid for your sins at Calvary. The juice and the bread are significant symbols. The bread represents Jesus' body and the suffering He went through for your sins. The juice represents the blood of Jesus that was shed on the cross for your sins. When you eat the bread and drink the juice, you are remembering Jesus' sacrifice for your sins. The Lord's Supper does not save you, but it again reminds you of what Jesus did for you. Only those who believe in Jesus Christ as Savior should take the Lord's Supper.



LESSON TWELVE: Storing up Treasures in Heaven



Put it on piece by piece, through prayer, looking at the parts of the armor below. You would not go outside without first getting dressed neither should you start your day without out the armor on.

IO/AO WINDOW

The largest number of unreached people in the world live in a part of the world called the "10/40 Window." The window extends from West Africa to East Asia, from ten degrees north of the equator to forty degrees latitude north of the equator. It was given its name by mission strategist Luis Bush. This window encompasses the majority of the world's Buddhists, Muslims, and Hindus—billions of people who live in this part of the world have never heard of the good news of Jesus Christ. Two-thirds of the world's population live in the 10/40 window—approximately 5.1 billion people. The poverty level in these countries is very high—85% of those living in the window are the "poorest of the world's poor." Half of the world's least reached cities are in the window. They will be lost unless we, the people of God, reach them. You can make

a tremendous spiritual impact through praying for them daily that God would open the window for His message of love to be heard.
